FR JOE'S MUSINGS

In Matthew's Gospel today, Jesus asks the disciples "who do people say the Son of Man is"? and the disciples reported the many different responses that they had heard. The same question is still relevant today, and if we were to ask any cross section of the population this question, I am sure we would get many and varied responses.

I think most people would agree that there is enough evidence in the Bible to prove that Jesus did actually exist on earth about 2000 years ago, but who is he? He is both human and divine. He is a carpenter. He is a man who worked hard and got tired just like you and me. He probably got frustrated with some of the things other people did or said. But he is also the Son of God. He healed the sick. He raised people from the dead. Try to empathise with the human Jesus and get to know what he was like as a man. This will help you start to realise that many of his human and divine qualities are related, and that he is at the same time human and divine.

Or you can jump right in like Peter did and shout out to the whole world "Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the living God", but maybe we are not quite as bold as Peter yet. Our life is a journey, and one of our goals should be to get to know more about Jesus, to trust him to guide our actions in life, to love him and to realise that he loves each one of us much more than we can ever love him.

As we get to know Jesus more and more, we also need to spread the Good News to the multitudes in our society today who seem not to care about faith or religion. They seem to think that material goods are their goal in this world. But if they stopped to think I am sure they would realise there has to be more to life. There is some sort of longing inside us all for something more, something deeper. Where does this longing come from?

St Augustine probably said it best when he said "Our hearts are restless until they rest in You, O Lord". Maybe the longing inside us is God calling to us to get to know him better and to love him more. Pray to Him this week and try to get to know him better

Most of you know that Fr Joe is now on his well-earned holiday. He landed in Frankfurt and is currently spending time in Germany with his family and carrying out some University commitments in that country before moving on to Norway. Let us remember him in our prayers and pray that he has a safe and joyful holiday.


