FR JOE'S MUSINGS

The Gospel

Today's Gospel follows on from that of last week and sees Matthew again emphasising how the goods of this world are not what is important. He urges us to deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow Jesus. "What will it profit them if they gain the whole world but lose their eternal life" (Mat 16:25).

How can we put these words of Matthew into practice?

How can we deny ourselves? We could start with little things such as occasionally doing without something we like. One suggestion might be not to eat any meat on Fridays. This was once a rule of the church but it has been relaxed nowadays. We could easily do this and get ourselves used to a small amount of denial. Then, if we are keen we might consider fasting occasionally, that is, going without a whole meal once in a while; or we might donate some food to the poor via CatholicCare or the St Vincent de Paul society. There are numerous ways to help the poor and deny ourselves at the same time.

How can we take up our cross? One way we can do this is to put God front and centre in all aspects of our life. By this I mean not just when we pray but in everything we do and in everything we experience each day. We could come to daily Mass once a week and receive the Lord in Holy Communion. We could come to Adoration and spend an hour with him once a month. But even if we are unable to do these things we can talk to him while we travel to and from work or to the shops and make sure we say grace before meals and encourage our children to join in. I'm sure each family could find a way to take up the cross in their own home and in their own way of life.

A further way we could take up our cross is by accepting the responsibility to serve the parish community as a volunteer wherever help is needed. Most parish ministries only require you to help out once a month and training is provided. This would be a great step forward in helping us follow Jesus and get closer to him.

This weekend the **Bishop's appeal** will be held to raise some much needed funds to look after the retired priests of the Diocese. They have given their whole life to help and guide us towards Jesus – here is one way we can say thank you to them and at the same time deny ourselves.

Greetings from Fr Joe, who has now completed all his formal engagements in Germany and is heading to Norway to celebrate the 30th wedding anniversary of his brother and his wife. While there I know he will do some sightseeing and get involved in his latest project of sampling a large range of European beers!

I am sure Fr Joe would want to wish a **happy Fathers' Day** to all fathers, grandfathers and stepfathers, both living and deceased, and ask for Gods prayers for them all.
