FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Mt 21:28-32: Think once again

A bus driver and a priest die on the same day and stand in front of the gates of heaven. The bus driver is immediately let into the joys of heaven. The priest has to wait outside. Wait. Wait. He's slowly getting nervous. He rings loudly again until a voice comes on the intercom. "What's going on?" complains the priest. "I've worked and preached so much in God's vineyard and now I have to wait here for so long. I never saw the bus driver in the church. And he comes in straight away." Finally, the answer comes: "When you worked, preached, everyone slept; but when the bus driver drove, everyone prayed."

Jokes thrive primarily on clichés. For example: Pastors are pious and are immediately the first to go to heaven. And the joke breaks down the seemingly self-evident cliché. And that makes you laugh - and think. And so jokes are similar to the parables that Jesus tells. Parables - short stories that make you think and also smile.

Jesus said: But what do you think? A man had two sons, and he went to the first and said, My son, go and work in the vineyard today. But he answered and said, I will not. But afterward he regretted it and went. And the father went to the other son and said the same thing. But he answered and said, Yes, Lord! and did not go.

Which of the two did the Father's will? They said: The first. (Mt 21, 28-31)

When I first listen to it, I think to myself: this story is pretty thin and lacking in humour.

But: With parables it's like jokes, you have to know the images and clichés in order to understand the punch line and be able to smile.

"Going into the vineyard" is an analogy that describes our relationship with God. Whoever goes into the vineyard, God cares about him and her.

Jesus' indirect question seems pretty cheeky: How is it for you personally? Have you gone to the vineyard yet? Do you care about your religion, your faith, do you care about God?

The parable points the finger at no one. It simply tells matter-of-factly that a son obediently says yes and doesn't go to his father's vineyard. And that another son, less well-behaved, says no. No, father, I won't do that. I don't go to the vineyard. No, I have nothing to do with religion or with God. And not with the church either.

A nay-sayer. If the vineyard is called "church," more and more people today say no. And sometimes with good reasons. No, I don't belong to the church. No longer.

A very important little sentence tells the story of the son who first says no: "After that, later he regretted it." So, there is a later, an earlier and a today. The son says no today. Later - hours, days, maybe years, decades later - he regrets it. Later he thinks again.

The two brothers do not differ simply by doing or not doing. There is something different, something deeper, that one son has over the other. It's remorse. The introspection. The thinking. Think about your own life in the light of the eternal, in the light of God and then be ready for change.

And that's what the other son, who said yes, still has ahead of him: this deepened, painful reflection on his own life is an invitation to reflection.

I hear Jesus' parable as an invitation to reflection. To go into the depths of my own life. Into the hidden, also: into the unlived. "The hidden and forbidden zone of the sacred," is what the theologian Manfred Josuttis calls the vineyard, the thing with God. It is hidden, even forbidden, and highly intimate: honest reflection on my own life in the light of the eternal.
