Isaiah 5:1-7; Ps 79; Philippians 4:6-9; Matthew 21:33-43

FR JOE'S MUSINGS

The Peace of God is greater than we can understand.

In the year 62 (amidst the new political persecution of Christians by the Roman Emperor Nero) Paul wrote a letter to the Christian community in Phillipe. At that time, Paul was in prison in Rome. Apprehensive that his execution was close at hand, yet hoping somehow to visit the Philippians again, Paul explains that he was imprisoned for preaching the gospel of Christ. Though he welcomes death for Jesus' sake, he is equally concerned to continue his apostolate. Paul exhorts his readers to remain steadfast in their faith and to imitate the humility of Christ, who "emptied himself" and "became obedient unto death, even death on a cross" (2:7–8). To encourage the Philippians, he points to the *Peace of God* through the sacrificial death of Christ. He then continues to write: "Fill your minds with everything that is **true**, everything that is **noble**, everything that is **good** and **pure**, everything that we **love** and **honour**, and everything that can be thought **virtuous** or worthy of praise."

Despite the circumstance from which it was written, joy is all over the letter to the Philippians. In case of quarrels and disagreements, Paul recommends this cure: 'Rejoice in the Lord always.' People who are very happy, especially those who are very happy in the Lord, are not apt either to give offense or to take offense. Joy in the Lord is the cure for all discord. Again, Paul's joy wasn't based in a sunny optimism or positive mental attitude as much as it was the confidence that God was in control. It really was a joy in the Lord.

"Let your gentleness be known": Paul used an interesting ancient Greek word (epieikeia) that is translated as gentleness here. Other translations of the Bible translate epieikeia as patience, softness, the patient mind, modesty, forbearance, the forbearing spirit, or magnanimity. This word describes the heart of a person who trusts in the Lord who is the prince of peace and unity. It describes a person who is really free to let go of His anxieties and all the things that cause him stress, because he knows that the Lord will take up his cause.

Paul's letter serves me as a guide for *religious leadership*. As a Parish Priest (hence a *religious* leader of a local Catholic community), I am leading the Parish on the way of God and that of the Peace that God has gifted each of us with. The preaching of the Gospel is my focus and sole responsibility. I absolutely have *no competence on political issues*. My hope and prayers are that we all vote in the coming referendum according to our conscience. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* defines: Conscience is a judgment of reason whereby the human person recognizes the moral quality of a concrete act that he / she is going to perform, is in the process of performing, or has already completed. In all he / she says and does, the person is obliged to follow faithfully what he / she knows to be just and right. It is by the judgment of his / her conscience that the person perceives and recognizes the
