FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Caesar or / and God?

This Sunday's story was well written. It simply presents Jesus with the decision between the emperor and the state on the one hand and God and religion on the other. And no matter which side he chooses, either the Roman rulers or the representatives of the religion will attack him.

In this incident of today's Gospel, with masterful perfection he avoids all the cliffs and obstacles with which his questioners tried to trap him. He slips through their fingers like an eel, but interestingly not by saying any empty phrases, but brilliantly by unerringly exposing the question as wrong and with disarming simplicity. Not the emperor or God, not the state and the people or faith and religion - Give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's.

Being a Christian does not mean choosing between God and the world, even if this error is still widespread today; faith does not mean concentrating on the spiritual and mystical, and certainly not retreating into pious self-reflection. Jesus Christ makes it clear that my life in society and my religious convictions - my faith in God - must form a whole.

Being a Christian means taking seriously our responsibility for the world and our responsibility for other people, aware of our responsibility before God. And in the most diverse forms that our society and our lives allow today.

Responsibility for the world, however, means that Christians are to engage beyond politics because God is also above political ideologies. Rather, Christian responsibility for the world has its very origin in charity which in Greek is AGAPE-LOVE.

Agape is a form of love that is commonly referred to as 'neighbourly love', the love ethic, or sometimes 'universal love'. It rests on the idea that all people are our 'brothers and sisters' who deserve our care and respect. Agape is authentic and true love because it lacks self-interest, self-gratification, or self-preservation. It is motivated by the interest and welfare of all others. It is global and compassionate, rather than focused on a single individual or a few people.

As the late German Pope Benedict XVI warned us: We cannot live this sacrificial agape-love all on our own power. "We cannot always give, we must also receive," he writes (Deus Caritas Est, no. 7). Therefore, if we wish to love others, we must constantly return to that ultimate source for agape in our own lives: Jesus Christ. We will only be able to truly love others here on earth to the extent that we are drinking deeply from the love of God Himself.

Accordingly, AGAPE-LOVE purifies politics since it brings forth authentic justice of all: Justice is both the aim and the intrinsic criterion of all politics, which by its very nature has to do with ethics. The state must inevitably face the question of how justice can be achieved here and now.

But this presupposes an even more radical question: What is justice? The problem is one of practical reason; but if reason is to be exercised properly it must undergo constant purification, since it can never be completely free of the danger of a certain ethical blindness caused by the dazzling effect of power and special interests. At this point "politics and faith meet." Politics is the realm of reason, and faith can help liberate reason from its blind spots and enable it to be more fully itself.

Caritas (AGAPE-LOVE) is the way, the only way, of the Church. Benedict points to the history of monasticism and the saints—Anthony, Francis, Ignatius, Vincent de Paul, Teresa of Calcutta—who are "the true bearers of light within history, for they are men and women of faith, hope, and love." And, above all, he points to Mary, for whom "the Word of God becomes her word, and her word issues from the Word of God." That Word and that word is always and forever the word of caritas discovered in the truth that "God is love, and he who abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him." Fr Joe

BLUE MOUNTAINS REFUGEES SUPPORT GROUP

The Youth Shoe Box Project has thrived over the past eight years thanks to the generosity and support of the Blue Mountains Community. The Blue Mountains Refugee Support Group and Disability Provider, Able@2 will team up with the community and lead the project again in 2023. We would love to have your help, so are inviting you to join us this year. The project was originally the 2015 brainchild of two high school students, Alana and Annabelle. Since then, we have distributed 2418 shoeboxes of Christmas boxes to children seeking refuge and asylum, in the Greater Sydney and Mountains area. Some even made it as far as Canberra in 2022. The project offers the opportunity to work collaboratively in order to spread kindness, connection and compassion for others.
