FR JOE'S MUSINGS

How to Embrace the Richness of our Poverty in our Prayer

The natural focus of spiritual retreat is prayer. Yet, it is not easy to concentrate and to persevere in prayers. It frustrates me greatly because of my inability to stay in focus and to persevere in my prayers. I can't resist the distractions of mind and body.

Not only am I confused about the content of my prayers. Also, I fail to pray "wholeheartedly": My prayers seem not to have roots in my heart. This experience clearly manifests my "spiritual poverty / misery". Saint Paul describes this misery succinctly: "We do not know what we should ask for to pray as we ought." (Rom 8:26).

Are we to resign from praying? Are we ashamed of our weakness?

There is another mistake that we often make when we are challenged by our weakness. We implore God to make us strong in resisting all temptations and distractions as if we say to ourselves: "I could do it better if I have the strength". Here, we are praying for "our" strength, when in fact it is the power of God that liberates us. When tempted by the devil, Jesus did not ask to be strong. Rather, he only prayed to fulfill obediently the will of the Father. Jesus acknowledges his weakness and surrenders himself to the power of the Father. Whoever refuses to be weak refuses the power of God according to the words of St Paul: "Whenever I am weak, then I am strong...My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfectly in weakness." (2 Cor 10:7). This is not fostering sloth or slovenliness, but projecting a new realistic view of our poverty transfigured by the power of the resurrection. One day, when all our claims to achieve holiness on our own are exhausted and we ourselves are "exhausted", God will transform our weakness into his power.

Like many things in our life, we want to be in charge. With the spiritual life, however, things are different. When it comes to prayer, it is not me, but God who is in charge. When we have nothing to cling on to ourselves, it there that we encounter the power of the Holy Spirit.

God gives us the grace, and at the same time gives us his merciful love to contemplate our poverty in this light. Jesus alone can know us in our ultimate truth with all our duplicities and conditionings, but he is also the only one loving us to that extent, as he contemplates our darkness and poverty in the light of his glorious Cross that makes his mercy

This is where we really need to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit to probe the depths of God as well as the depths of the person's heart transformed by the Holy Spirit: "The Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God... Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God." (1 Cor 2:10f).

Getting in touch with our own poverty / weakness / misery means getting in touch with an area which is the source of the most senseless and maddest trust. God's madness is revealed in the folly of the Cross: Christ empties himself totally to let his being be filled by the Glory of God.

The Holy Spirit reveals a strange secret to us: the art of reaching out to our misery as if it were a precious pearl, difficult to find and worthy of the most passionate search.

I would like to conclude with a saying from Saint Therese of Lisieux. A few days before she died, she advised her sister Celine, who was distressed about her weakness and imperfection, "to love her poverty gently."


