FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Don't take everything so easily...

At the moment there is not much good news: the rising cost of living is bothering us, the wars in Ukraine and in the Middle East are exhausting us all. And things aren't any better in the Church. That's why we really need good news. Today's Gospel of Mark brings us not only good news, but also glad tidings. He speaks of the fulfilled time (peplērotai ho kairos) that is connected with Jesus' proclamation of the kingdom of God. It is now God's time. In Mark, Jesus claims that this *KAIROS*, this decisive moment of God's intervention was happening in his ministry. The kingdom of God has come near to bring light to those who walk in darkness.


It is so easy to despair and lose heart when there is darkness. It's so easy to give up and give in to fate. It is so easy to become a cynic and, at worst, to support an unjust system through passivity or even actively. It's so easy to believe that there's nothing but bad news, so why not try to make the best of it for yourself? It's so easy to lose hope.

Christ brings hope and new life to all those who are in despair. The Kingdom is present in history in that the power of evil spirits was being broken, sins forgiven, and sinners gathered into God's friendship. That's why Mark calls people: Repent and believe in the gospel, the good news.

By asking people to repent and believe in the good news, Jesus is telling them: Don't get used to the circumstances! **Don't take everything so easily!** Don't just become a cog in the wheel of arbitrariness and injustice! Don't let yourself be pushed into the role of victim! Don't lose heart, don't lose hope! No, repent, or in other words, turn back. Change your mind, have a change of heart, change your attitude. And not only that: believe in the gospel, believe in the good news. Believe that God calls you to actively participate in the changing circumstances, that you are the ones through whom the Kingdom of God can be experienced. Believe that you are a light in the darkness. Let us be renewed and let us breath in the Good News of Hope as we begin the new year.

We surely need renewal for our Parish. Concretely, we need to repair the roof of the church building. After nearly 30 years the roof begins to leak and its wood structure shows concerning damages. Now, it is the opportune time to do some major works on the roof to keep it for the next 30 years or so. We need to urgently recoat and replace the rusty screws to protect water from entering under the roof and hence into the church. Because of its massive size, distinguished construction, and the need to add anchors on the roof that would allow painters to stay safe on the roof, it is expected that the total cost would be around 150-200K. If we don't do it now, it would be very costly in 2 or 3 years when the roof would require not just repainting but replacing. It could cost us up to 1 million to do so.
