FR JOE'S MUSINGS

How do we celebrate together, and not exclude?


While I do not wish to enter a debate about the choice of 26 January as a celebratory date, I would like to offer my view on how we can celebrate without exclusion. As you already know, there are various and different forms of celebration: a celebration may be conducted as commemoration, as a thanksgiving or as a social gathering for entertainment or fun. In general, a celebration is the act of showing appreciation. I guess that when we celebrate Australia Day, we first recall the fact that we are all Australians (I am a German citizen, but feel like an Australian). Hence we appreciate and celebrate the values that bind all Australians together. Australians pride themselves as being fair, meaning a 'fair go' for all that embraces, a) mutual respect; b) tolerance; c) compassion for those in need and d) equality of opportunity for all. This means that Australia Day calls also for respect of the sisters and brothers of the First Nations. It is important to acknowledge their sufferings and struggle not just with the Day, but also in other fields. Our task is to strive to be friends together who listen to each other's concern, who care and seek to heal the wounds and so improve each other's life. Between friends, there should be no gap! We know that there is still a lot of work ahead of us.

Australia Day is also an opportunity to give THANKS to GOD for the opportunities that are given to each of us. When I see so many families joint together from various corners of the world to celebrate, it just melts my heart. I can't recall any place on the earth that can bring so many colours together to celebrate. Personally, I am very grateful for being giving the opportunity to live and to serve in this wonderful country. Having lived here for 15 years, I am getting better in saying "G'day, mate", without feeling embarrassed.

Wholeheartedly, I say THANK YOU for your wonderful Aussie friendship and welcoming spirit!

Let's now move to another topic. Traditionally, our ecumenical soup event during Lent would happen over three Sundays. However, this year the Uniting church, the Baptist church and St Finbar's agree to have only one Soup Sunday which is scheduled for **Sunday** 18th February at 11.30 at the Uniting church in Glenbrook. We will then rotate the schedule so that each community will host one soup Sunday over the three years period. The reason for the concentration to one Sunday is that it will foster a closer relationship between the churches as we all cooperate and share responsibilities by assisting each other with the setting up and provision of soups.
