FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Dear Friends.

The collapse of a construction company is nothing new. It happens from time to time. New is only that the cost rise of cost of living has accelerated the rate of insolvency forcing construction companies to collapse.


The gospel of this Sunday speaks of Jesus' cleansing of the temple in Jerusalem. Construction of the temple began under Herod the Great in 20 or 19 B.C., which means that Jesus' cleansing of the temple takes place in 27 or 28 A.D. Most of the work on the temple has been completed by this time, but refinements will continue until 63 A.D., only seven years before the Romans will destroy the temple.

The cleansing has to do with the fact that the sanctuary has been degraded to a market hall, a place of commerce (Greek, oikon emporiou). Jesus is not anti-temple, but anti-exploitation. He acknowledges the temple as his Father's house and insists that it be treated with the reverence due the house of the Lord. However, a house of prayers and encounter with God has become a den of thieves. Hence, it suggests unethical business practices taking place in the temple! Hence, the sanctuary has become a house of sins.

Jesus' action should make us alert. The question is then: What is true worship? John provides us with an answer: "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:19).

The event of the cleansing of the Temple is more than just an angry outburst against the merchants and the abuses that were taking place at that time. It is an attack on the Temple cult, of which the sacrificial animals and the special Temple moneys collected there were a part. Christ's death on the cross, followed by the tearing of the Temple curtain into two, and then, in years to come by the physical destruction of the Temple, brought an end to the old economy of worship and inaugurated the new one: the true worship will now take place in the new Temple, in Christ himself, who is the dwelling place of the Father and the Spirit. Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, however, is constantly represented by the Church when the sacrament of the Eucharist is celebrated. Our "spiritual worship" consists of our submission to God "in spirit and in truth" (John 4:24). This submission is internal (spiritual), but also physical (bodily). This submission of the human person takes place not somehow in isolation, or in parallel with Christ's submission to the Father represented in the Eucharist, but in deep relation to it. In the Eucharist, the spiritual element is combined with the physical component—through the visible signs and actions, invisible, spiritual realities take place.

True worship is not about our creativity and innovative approaches, aiming at our self-fulfillment. Rather, true worship also leads us into the practice of self-giving. The Eucharist draws us into Jesus' act of self-oblation. More than just statically receiving the incarnate Logos, we enter into the very dynamic of his self-giving. Union with Christ is also union with all those to whom he gives himself. I cannot possess Christ just for myself; I can belong to him only in union with all those who have become, or who will become, his own. Communion draws me out of myself towards him, and thus also towards unity with all Christians. We become "one body", completely joined in a single existence. We can thus understand how *agape* (self-giving love) also became a term for the Eucharist: there God's own *agape* comes to us bodily, in order to continue his work in us and through us.

While Jesus was not running a construction company, he was very engaged in building up a new temple where true and lasting worship takes place.
