FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Christ is RISEN - The Eucharist as Blessing of Peace for a Wounded and Suffering World

The alternative Gospel of this Easter Sunday is taken from Mark 16:1-8. Biblical commentators consider it as an Epilogue, a section or speech at the end of a book or play that serves as a comment on or a conclusion to what has happened. Hence, the "Tomb", used five times in the Mk 16 is a commentary on the "wilderness" that dominates the



first part of Mark's gospel. Both places are hostile to life. In both cases, there is a movement from outside to inside (into the wilderness and into the tomb), and then from inside to outside. Paradoxically, new life also emerges from these places.

Paul declares descent into and rising out of the water in baptism to be equivalent of burial and rising from the dead. In Mark, the descent of the Spirit upon Jesus and his manifestation as Son happens on the occasion of his baptism, while in Romans 1:3-4 these are bound up with his resurrection from the dead.

In Mark 16, rising from the dead is linked to the celebration of the Eucharist. Verses16:1-2 "When the Sabbath was past. Very early on the first day of the week they went to the tomb as the sun was rising" are a stark reminder that early Christians broke bread on the first day of

This was Mark's answer to the question that the women raised when they had discovered the "empty tomb". Not only has God broken the power of death (the young man in a white robe [stolē leukē] sitting in the tomb is not Jesus, but represents the newly baptised who has died and risen with Christ), but the Eucharist is now the place that warrants the ever presence of the Risen Christ. This the reason for Mark's insertion that Christ "HAS RISEN (egerthe)" and therefore he is "NOT HERE" (in the tomb, but in the breaking of the bread!) Here, Mark removes the difficulty experienced by the women who were amazed at the removal of a "very large stone" that had locked Jesus inside the

The Eucharist is where Christians encounter Christ. There is an intimate relationship between the Christian and Christ. It is entering, in communion with Christ, into his paschal mystery: his death, resurrection and ascension. There is an actualism to his understanding of the Eucharist, a participatio actuosa (active participation) in Christ's eucharistic action. Benedict writes in "God Is Charity": "The Eucharist draws us into Jesus' act of self-oblation...we enter into the very dynamic of his self-giving." So intimate is the communion the Eucharist effects between Christ and the Christian that Joseph Ratzinger did not hesitate to speak of our becoming Eucharist in Christ.

At the Easter Vigil, men and women throughout the world profess their faith and are baptized into the lifegiving waters of Jesus' death. They are anointed with chrism and join the communion of the faithful around the altar sharing in the Eucharist. All of those already initiated into the paschal mystery once again profess their faith in the renewal of our baptismal promises. The profession of faith both in mind and heart leads to the living profession, a living sacrifice of praise, through word and deed sharing in the lifegiving mission of Christ Jesus.

The Eucharist is the Easter Blessing of Peace gifted to his Church and the world by the Risen Christ since "by its nature the Eucharist is the sacrament of peace." (Benedict XVI, Sacramentum caritatis, no. 49). Each time, Christians exchange the sign of peace they are reminded also of their responsibility for the world: "At Mass this dimension of the eucharistic mystery finds specific expression in the sign of peace. Certainly, this sign has great value. In our times, fraught with fear and conflict, this gesture has become particularly eloquent, as the Church has become increasingly conscious of her responsibility to pray insistently for the gift of peace and unity for herself and for the whole human family."

On Easter, the Risen Christ brings his peace to our lacerated and suffering world: "Let us bring him into our everyday lives: through gestures of peace in these days marked by the horrors of war, through acts of reconciliation amid broken relationships, acts of compassion toward those in need, acts of justice amid situations of inequality and of truth in the midst of lies. And above all, through works of love and fraternity." (Pope Francis, *Homily on Easter Vigil*, 2022)
