FR JOE'S MUSINGS

Only a few weeks ago we celebrated the great events of Easter, the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This was not some abstract piece of history, but something that actually happened, and something that has had a big impact on all of us, because it is the means whereby each of us can get to see the face of God in heaven. It was a momentous event that we should thank God for every day of our lives. The tragic events of the last couple of weeks, the stabbings at Bondi Junction, and the stabbing at Wakeley and the subsequent riotous behaviour, do not reflect well on some of us as children of God. The second reading at Mass this weekend calls on us to love one another, not in word or speech but in truth and action. Those who helped the victims were very much showing their love for their fellow human beings by helping barricade and bring down the attackers and by caring for the injured and ensuring others did not come into any danger. As Christians we thank them for what they did.

The Gospel this weekend is the story of the vine and the branches, and I think one key message is that we must abide in God - we cannot do it alone. Abiding is making a commitment to Jesus, and developing a close relationship with him, like that of a vine and its branches. In this way we get life for our soul and energy for our body. Jesus says that if you abide in Him, and His words abide in you, you can ask for whatever you wish and it will be done for you (Jn 15:7). What a great offer -let our goal be to take Jesus up on this offer immediately.

You will probably be aware that last weekend we started distributing the books of raffle tickets to raise \$50,000 to repair our church roof. This weekend is the second week of distribution. If you were not at Mass last weekend, please make sure you collect one or more books of tickets after Mass this weekend and sell as many as you can. It is our church roof and we all need to contribute to its maintenance. I would especially like to thank Tricia Murnane who is organising this raffle on behalf of the Parish Finance Committee.

Finally, we hope that Fr Joe has had a restful and relaxing week away, and that he is back feeling re-energised and ready for action!
