<u>SAFEGUARDING – IF IT'S GOD'S BUSINESS, IT'S ALL OUR</u> BUSINESS

It is a theme which is replicated throughout the whole Bible, with God portrayed in the 121st Psalm, as the keeper of Israel. This Hebrew word can be translated as Safeguard, which is God's need and wish for the Church, not only that we are safe, but we all work for safety for all people.

That is affirmed in the theological idea of Salvation. In both the Greek and the Latin version of the word, the root of the word is safekeeping. The theological imperative of God is the safety of his children. Now abuse in all its forms at its heart denies people that opportunity to flourish. It robs them of that right. Abuse is therefore a fundamental denial of the Gospel, and a fundamental denial of all that God desires and purposes for us: which is why our God is so implacably opposed to it. And his judgment falls on abuse no less severely today than when it fell upon the snake.

Safeguarding – abuse on the one hand and human flourishing on the other – are matters of the deepest concern to God. So, they must be of the deepest concern to us. You can say that these are matters of core business for God – so they must be matters of core business for us too. At St Finbar's, there is zero tolerance of any kind of abuse. Here I echo the warning of Bishop Vincent: "The Diocese of Parramatta is committed to being a community of safeguarding that actively promotes the dignity and rights of children and of all persons, particularly those who may be vulnerable. We have a zero-tolerance to abuse of any form. We are committed to ensuring that all children and adults are safe, respected, protected and supported whilst in our care." Pope Francis calls abuse a crime! Hence, there is no excuse for sexual abuse, abuse of power, and the abuse of conscience. Pope Francis continues in a letter to the US bishops: "The abuse also harms the church, and the church is my mother and it hurts so much when she is wounded, when she is soiled."

Safeguarding is not just a business of the Parish Priest, although I am very aware of my position and potential risk. I keep reminding myself of the words that a mother of a child who was abused by a priest: "People, and especially children, don't see (just) a person in you, but (they see) Christ, Jesus, in whom they trust all the same without limits. It is something enormous and strong, but also very fragile and vulnerable."

Recent ACU research reveals that there is still a lack of awareness and uncertainty about how to detect abuse and act upon it with confidence. Professor Higgins, the lead author, said that more needed to be done to keep people safe.
