FR JOE'S MUSINGS

For a CULTURE OF DISCERNING: Mark 4:26-34

This Sunday's gospel uses the image of the sower and a mustard seed. I would like to take these two images to reflect on the gift of discernment and its related maturity in faith and good works.

The fruit-bearing (4:28-29) in the first parable, and the act of sowing (4:31-32) in the second, echo vocabulary in the parable of the sower, and suggest that we are learning more here about what it means to sow the word, and that this sowing of the word is related to the kingdom — that the Word the sower plants (4:14) is the seed of the kingdom itself.

The first parable of the kingdom is again a story of sowing and harvesting. The sower sows and then sleeps and rises, night and day, as step by step the kingdom grows, invisibly at first and then in the form of a stalk, then a head, then the full grain in the head. The word for grain in 4:29 appears also in 4:7-8 where it is translated fruit (as also, for example, in John 15:1-17). So, while this is about the natural progression of rising wheat, it is also, like the image in 4:29, an image of fruitfulness.

We know from the earlier parable that some seed will fall on deaf ears and into rocks and among thorns and will not be fruitful, but in this image as in the earlier one, we are encouraged not to dwell too much on that. We cannot control what happens after the word is sown. We just sow it. Only that. The sower here does not even weed or water, just sows and waits in peaceful trust. If there is room for us to plant the seeds of the word, for the rest we, along with the sower of the parable, can leave that to God.

The mustard plant presents the contrast between the smallness of the present kingdom and the relative largeness of it in its fullness. This kingdom will grow generously and abundantly from the smallest of all seeds to the largest of all shrubs.

This image of the mustard seed may serve to remind the Church and us of our limitation as sowers of the Word of God. The Church and us, we are not the ones who enable growth in numbers and faith. Faith is a gift and an outcome of God's grace.

We may prepare the soil and sow the seed, but rain and sun are God's gifts. On this Paul is very clear: "I planted the seed in your hearts, and Apollos watered it, but it was God who made it grow. It's not important who does the planting, or who does the watering." (1 Cor 3:6).

Today, it appears that bishops, priests and laity are very busy in organizing, designing strategies and taking actions to renew the Church. While RENEWAL is always welcome because we cannot ignore the working of the Holy Spirit, it is important to accept that we do not CONTROL and anticipate the outcome in a **self-deceptive** manner. Worst, that we conflate human control as the work of the Holy Spirit. This may lead to preoccupation and *obsession* with *human* ideas and self reliance. As a result, obsession leads to possession, a condition where a person comes under total and complete control of a demonic force.

Discernment is from the root Greek word "diakresis" which means the ability to distinguish between godly and ungodly spirits, as the Apostle Paul used it. The Pauline message is that discernment is said to be a gift, not an attribute of human comprehension. A **culture of discernment** assumes the leaders are mature in Christ and will continually draw the community into more maturity.
