REFLECTION

Today we reflect on key teachings from Deuteronomy, Hebrews, and the Gospel of Mark. These readings guide us in understanding love, obedience, and Jesus' eternal priesthood.

- Love of God: In Deuteronomy, we are commanded to love God with all our heart, soul, and strength. This shows the importance of putting God first in our lives. Deuteronomy also calls us to keep God's commandments, as obeying these commandments brings us closer to God and guides our actions.
- **Jesus' Eternal Priesthood**: Hebrews emphasizes that Jesus is our eternal high priest. His priesthood is perfect and unchanging, unlike the priests of the old covenant. Jesus offers himself as the perfect sacrifice for our sins. This sacrifice is once and for all, showing his great love and mercy.
- Greatest Commandments: In Mark, Jesus teaches that the greatest commandments are to love God and love our neighbour. These two commandments summarize the entire law and the prophets. Jesus' teaching in Mark unites love and law. True love for God naturally leads to loving others and keeping God's commandments. When we are committed to love, we are not far from the kingdom of God. It's like the open door to the kingdom. Our need for love sometimes brings us to darker places and selfishness, so we need the help of God that love be purified and so bring us closer and closer to the sincerity and purity of love in God's kingdom.

It has been a very busy week at St Finbar's:

- * Friday saw the **Feast of All Saints**. On this day we honoured those holy men and women who have gone before us in faith and have done so in a glorious way. As we honour these great champions of faith, let's reflect upon who they are and what role they continue to play in the life of the Church.
- * Saturday is **All Soul's Day** when we remember our loved ones who have passed away in faith. We also are reminded that heaven is the goal of all our lives. We are called to live a righteous life through trusting and obeying God. If we remain in friendship with God, we can abide with Him forever in heaven. The parish had its memorial Vigil Mass and remembrance ceremony on the Friday evening.
- * Friday was also a significant day for St Finbar's parish because we welcomed our new Parish Priest, **Fr John Hogan**, and saw him take up duty and say his first Mass in our parish. Please introduce yourselves to Fr John, and welcome him personally. It will take him a little while but he will gradually learn all your names

ST. FINBAR'S PARISH NEWS

ROOF RESTORATION

You will probably be aware that work commenced last Monday of the restoration of the roof of our parish church. It will effectively be done in three stages: Firstly, and inspection of the roof timbers, replacement of those damaged, and replacement of the screws that hold down the roofing material. This was done during the past week, with the workers taking a smoko break during morning Mass times.



The second phase will commence next week and will see large machines on

site for the washing/cleaning of the entire roof. This will be noisy with the possibility of spray falling on anyone who is nearby, thereby creating possible safety issues for parishioners. For this reason there will be no Masses Tuesday to Friday inclusively next week.

The third phase during the following week (weather permitting) will involve spray painting the entire roof with the new top coat. As this is likely to see paint drifts in the event of any breeze, it may also create and unsafe environment, and so, again, there will be no Masses Tuesday to Friday of that week. The parish mass program is expected to return to normal as soon as the roof is finished.
