FATHER JOHN PONDERS.....

"There is no freedom like seeing myself as I am and not losing heart." (Elizabeth J. Canham)

Last weekend we pondered the truth that we are children of God, as we saw in the first letter of Saint John. In that context Saint John describes the Father in heaven as lavishing his love on us. 'Lavishing', what a word and what a God! The heavenly Father holds little back in pouring out his love for us. So, we are convinced that each one of us is precious to God.

The Lord Jesus in his death and resurrection has restored integrity to humanity and we are wrapped up in the power of heavenly grace for that integrity to become the way of living for each of us. To convert us by the virtues of Christian living.

But, then we notice quite a discrepancy between what we believe in this regard and in how we think and behave. Each of us has built up a reservoir of all sorts of thinking, both conscious and unconscious, which appear to be at variance with the sublime status of being a child of God. Well, this is easily answered by understanding that while we have been saved we are left with the temporal consequences of the Fall from Grace. Traditionally this has been understood as having "dimmed intellects and weakened wills". And when we think about it, such a description seems to fit well. What one of us doesn't want to improve ourselves but find it so difficult? Yes, we can motivate ourselves to build ourselves slowly, ever so slowly, into the likeness of Christ.

It does mean that we need to improve our self-knowledge so that we can do something about it. There are vast areas in each one of us, hidden from view, that need to come to light, to be brought to the surface for scrutiny to see what needs to be transformed into virtue. The hidden world will include our world view that has been building up since childhood, our whole value system which has likewise emerged with little or no attention, and on top of those two large areas we find ourselves with a plethora of expectations which may be quite imperfect and usually are all about me rather than the other. And all of this is only for starters.

But, we do not lose heart. We strengthen our desire to love God more and ask for all the graces we need to become aware of what we need to do about ourselves to become loving children of God. The quote from Elizabeth Canham can really help in giving us courage to begin the journey of seeing ourselves as we are which is a firm foundation for improvement, and to not lose heart because we are doing something beautiful for God, to become truly human as Christ became truly human
