FATHER JOHN PONDERS.....

'If you read history, you will find that the Christians who did the most for the present world were just those who thought most of the next.' (C.S. Lewis)

C.S. Lewis is very well know as the author of the Namia novels, the first of which is the "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe" a modern day metaphor of the overcoming of evil through the death and resurrection of the hero, Aslan. Very Christian indeed! But Lewis wrote many Christian books of which the "Screwtape Letters" is a formidable exploration of the foibles of Fallen Humanity. Lewis certainly had deep psychological insights into how we operate and we would be well-served in paying attention to what he has to say. We are in this world, with God's intention that we live worthy lives. Hopefully, most of the time, we try to do this for the love of God and our neighbour. In considering our past we may be able to observe many occasions when we have excelled. We have striven against all odds to achieve a positive outcome. We can be rightly proud that we have made a contribution to our own lives, the lives of our families and friends, indeed to the wider community. Resting on our laurels is not the way of the Christian. Identifying the contributions we have made in the past is not the opportunity to sit back, rather it is the opportunity to keep going with confidence knowing we can achieve greatness. It can also be the opportunity to check whether or not our achievements are heading in the right direction.

As Lewis reminds us, Christians who did the most for this world were those who thought most of the next world. I am reminded of the glorious contribution of the monks in long-ago England. They were given vast tracts of land to build their monasteries to live their religious life and look after themselves. However, these lands tended to be marshland and not much good for anything. So, the monks set about draining the land and making it fit for agriculture. Crops were sown and harvests gathered which gave work and wages for the common folk. The Benedictine motto is "laborare et orare" meaning "work and prayer". While working for secular advantage for themselves and their poor neighbours, they had their minds, hearts and souls very much on heaven. They benefitted the poor labourers by seeing them as citizens of heaven to be treated well on earth. A positive outcome for all. There is not anything wrong with making substantial contributions in helping the world go around. We are duty-bound to fulfil the gifts and talents with which we have been endowed by God. How great then, that if we keep a focus on heavenly things, we may excel in our efforts in secular things to have them blessed by heavenly things!
