FATHER JOHN PONDERS......

"How can you draw close to God when you are far from your own self? Grant Lord that I may know myself that I may know thee." (Saint Augustine in the Confessions)

"None can know God who does not first know himself." (Meister Eckhart)

At this time of year we find ourselves in the throes of celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ. It is an occasion whereby our hearts are lifted up as we realise that we have not been forgotten by God. Our salvation has yet to be enacted. But we bask in the security that Christ not only takes on death but overcomes it in the resurrection. That new life he shares with us. Even now we are children of the resurrection and are able to live our lives illuminated by the presence of Christ who leads us to the Father.

Yet we tend to struggle to know God even when everything is handed to us on a plate. Having faith in the teachings of the Church is one thing, coming to know God personally is quite another. Our fear to do so is possibly based on a profound sense of inability to engage with Mystery. How do we become comfortable with the One who is so ineffable, beyond description, that we would feel incompetent in our efforts. But this is likely based on a false appreciation of who we are as children of God. We begin to realise that we are limited, and not a bad thing to learn – it is the truth. But God is quite capable in communicating himself with people who are limited. It is his nature as

So, what might be at the bottom of our reticence? Well, our quotes above from two very holy men point to our lack of self-knowledge. It is true that the ancient Greeks encouraged people to "know thyself" as an antidote to complacency in living a full life. A little pondering by ourselves can soon reveal who we really are. We can recognise our faults and failings and the life traps we continually fall into. Some reflection can help us identify the unhelpful ways of thinking we have come to acquire and the intention to be rid of them. We know we are not perfect but this should not lead us into denial and hide ourselves from God like Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden! As children of God we are blessed with gifts and talents and we should acknowledge these too. A healthy balance of recognizing the good and the bad in us and owning them will establish a strong platform for us to engage with God.

This self-knowledge, accepted as the truth of who we are, makes us real. We cannot establish a positive relationship with God while wearing a mask. If we are real with God, God will be real with us and the relationship will flourish. As for fear of the Mystery, have no fear. God will reveal himself as promised!


