
As we begin a new year we tend to remind ourselves of how inadequate we are and make lots of resolutions to overcome bad habits and unhealthy ways of thinking. We may have in mind some notion of becoming a superman or superwoman by putting into effect what we believe to be a schedule of necessary changes to our lives. In our imagination we expect such results that may not correspond to the efforts we put in nor the mindset that promotes the changes we desire. Failure to achieve our goals may land us back where we started, if not further back, because we conclude that I am falling apart and pessimism easily asserts itself. Feelings that I am no good may predominate.

In view of our quote today, from Wade Davis, we can pick ourselves up from such despondency by recognising that we are not dying nor are we falling apart, but we are changing. And change is slow, but we tend to be so adamant about becoming perfect by the evening that we don't give personal growth adequate room to live and breathe, slowly achieving great change over time.

In the Christmas period we contemplate how much the world changed by the direct intervention by God. Yes, God can cause immediate change. Humanity held the divine in itself – yet so many didn't even recognise it. Even so, Christ did not begin his public ministry for thirty years presumably to be ready to minister when he was adequately resourced in his humanity. If Christ took his time why can't we take the time to develop our potential, slowly but surely. Aesop's fable of the tortoise and the hare is a positive lesson to all of us. Slow down and do things properly by establishing firm foundations. It is not our lot to be God in getting things right in our lives, but we are to be dependent on the Lord. It is true that there are "wonderfully positive things out there" and we can be part of a wonderful world making a great contribution. But, one thing

Resolution: stop rushing headlong into things all the time! It requires a different mindset and consequently a different methodology. But a positive outcome is all the more assured.

The world changed at Christmas by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. This Holy Spirit never ceases to outpour into the world. Include the Holy Spirit in your daily attempts at self-improvement and slowly you may abandon self-satisfying improvement into God-satisfying improvement which speaks of heavenly desires for heavenly things. Seek these and your world will fall into eternity.
