Father John ponders......

Our lives improve only when we take chances - and the first and most difficult risk we can take is to be honest with ourselves." (Walter Anderson)

Since the Fall from Grace the history of humanity seems to follow a pathway of concealment. Even after that infamous Original Sin we find Adam and Eve attempting to shift the blame as to their wrongdoing. "The woman you gave me did it". "The serpent made me do it". This concealment is very much associated with the deadly trap of justifying ourselves. We cannot afford to be wrong, otherwise our egos would fail in self-assertion to be the best thing since sliced bread! No, we would rather self-promote than face the dreaded reality of the truth. Complaining is another artificial way of shifting out blame. Adam blames God for giving him Eve in the first place, and maybe Eve blames God for creating the serpent in the first place. Oh, how does our heart find rest in the bosom of what is definitely a false self. Which, of course, leads to a contrived image of who we are! It may satisfy us, but it cannot satisfy the truth.

Being honest with ourselves is certainly a difficult risk. At the heart and soul of this risk is the perceived peril of destroying the very sense of who I am. This is a very serious matter, we have spent our lives constructing who I think I am only to discover that that's not who I really am. We seem to have another persona of which we are not aware. What can we do about it? The Greek philosopher Socrates declared that the unexamined life is not worth living. While that may sound somewhat severe, there is a truth there that if we want to move forward in establishing a self which has integrity, then we can only do so by correcting that which needs to be corrected. And how will we know what is to be corrected?

This is where we need to acquire a deep sense of humility. We don't like to move out of our comfort zone where we believe everything is working well. But if our lives are to improve, then we need to take a chance, as Walter Anderson suggests. Taking a chance is hardly walking the plank of a pirate ship; taking a chance is to move to newer ground, to push ourselves to establish fresh virtues to establish in our lives. Taking a chance requires insights into who I think I am by listening closely to others who may know me better than I do myself. Their subtle feedback can be a goldmine in clearing away the cobwebs of my self-delusion to establish an improving self-identity which stands up to the desires of Christ for our perfection. "I have come so that they may have life, life in abundance." (John 10:10)
