Father John ponders......

"Besides the noble art of getting things done, there is the noble art of leaving things undone. The wisdom of life consists in the elimination of non-essentials." -- Lin Yutang

Who wouldn't want to be relieved of the burden of having so much to do with not enough time to do it? We start off the day with such a long list of things to do and the day takes us over. We feel like we have been abducted by some alien force which won't put us down to earth until we have reached exhaustion with still more things to do. We put ourselves under enormous pressure and often we arrive at the end of the day with yet more to do. This brings about a feeling of dissatisfaction with ourselves. No wonder we can feel so overwhelmed at times. To reach day's end with a sense of incompleteness is not a good remedy for a good night's sleep.

Well, we do put ourselves under pressure, especially when we believe that only our efforts keep the world turning around. Everything depends on us, and while this is not global in scale, even in the small confines of our own family or our own work, we tend to treat them as if we were running the world. On the one hand this is understandable. We take our responsibilities seriously and we believe it is incumbent on us to do as fine a job as possible, after all, we are serving others. On the other hand we may be leaving ourselves open to exhaustion to such an extent that we tire ourselves out and develop a distaste for all that we are doing and get ourselves into a mode of servility.

The key to attending to this, as with so much of the troubles we experience, is to see things in perspective. To see non-essentials and put them to one side, as our quote today would have us, we can easily arrange our workload to become more manageable. If we treat all we have to do with equal importance we are setting ourselves up for a severe depletion of resources, we couldn't possibly operate at such a level of intensity for very long. Arrange the most important things in your life first, especially God and family members, and the rest we can learn to treat as necessity requires. We shall see ourselves and our lives in perspective, treat each aspect of work with the importance it objectively deserves but no more, and soon we can find life to be more manageable. We may even have time for recreation and finish the day with a sense of the day having been managed well. An excellent formula for sweet dreams.
