Father John ponders.....

"We live in a world of theophanies. Holiness comes wrapped in the ordinary. There are burning bushes all around you. Every tree is full of angels. Hidden beauty is waiting in every crumb. Life wants to lead you from crumbs to angels, but this can happen only if you are willing to unwrap the ordinary by staying with it long enough to harvest its treasure." - Macrina Wiederkehr

A theophany is some way in which God reveals himself to us and noted spiritual writers have frequently drawn our attention to this. Saint Teresa of Avila noted that the main way God reveals himself is through a veil of symbols. We are generally not ready for direct revelation, our systems would be well overloaded by divinity and we might burst asunder! God quietly protects us from his awesomeness by ordinary revelations in the down-to-earth of things. But in order to benefit from these experiences we need to know how to pay attention. The British poet, Elizabeth Barret Browning, begins one of her poems with these words "Earth's crammed with heaven and every tree a burning bush....." Thankfully, we don't need to be mystics in order to savour heaven in the here and now. If creation is of God, both nature and humanity, it seems obvious that somehow creation will reflect the nature of its Originator.

Of course, we can be over-stimulated by the flotsam and jetsam of life which absorbs our attention as we tend to the business of life just to get through the day. In this absorption we end up missing out on life's finer things such as the presence of God manifesting itself. "To have the experience and miss the meaning" is one of the warnings of T.S. Eliot about those who do not lift their vision to higher things and so miss out on the real richness of life. Last weekend we considered the value of silence which can so readily give us access to deep down things. The deep down things of ordinary life can swell the soul and draw our heart's contemplation to mystery. And by mystery here we do not understand some kind of puzzle which we cannot solve. Mystery is the nature of God. To understand it we must stay with it long enough to harvest its treasure, as today's quotation recommends.

But we always seem to be in a rush, on the run 24/7, to such an extent that we don't give ourselves the time to contemplate that life, and the things of life, are depositories of God's presence and purpose. As Barret Browning explains in her poem, those who see (the burning bush) take off their shoes while the rest sit around eating blackberries. While blackberries may be very tasty, if we miss the revelation of God then life becomes insipid.

Maybe we can decide, even once a day, to pay attention and be on the lookout, for God draws us very close to his heart and those clues are everywhere.




