#### Father John ponders......

"To live is so startling it leaves little time for anything else." -Emily Dickenson

When the complications of life make us shudder we often go into panic because we cannot make sense of things. We wonder how we can go on, and look for countless ways to distract us. Meaning and purpose seem to go out of the window and we can find ourselves searching for easy answers to quell the discomfort of our emotional life. The painting known as "The Scream" created by Edvard Munch in 1893 is often depicted as the epitome of the human being's sense of isolation in a world of senseless meaning. And that was over a century ago. And countless others have commented on life as a trackless desert ever since.

Sometimes it takes a genius to offer such clarity that we can become astounded by a simplicity which draws everything together into a coherence which brings our lives back together. Our quotation today draws on a poem by Emily Dickenson, an American poet (1830-1860) who was unknown during her lifetime. Her poems mirror the simplicity of life showing us the profound insight of self-empowerment by attending to the smaller things of life and extracting the deeper meaning of throwing all one's efforts into doing things mighty well. Another of her poems begins: "Gentle make this bed, make this bed with awe, and in it wait 'til judgement break, excellent and fair." Even in the mundane affairs of life, such as making a bed, there is profound meaning to be found. For the believer life is shot through with the presence of God who is present in each moment of our lives even when they appear to be fruitless.

It is a matter of focusing our gaze to whatever we are engaged in so the we can extract the full flavour of God's presence who brings ultimate meaning and purpose. Thus, consecrating all our experiences. The more we pay attention, even to the small things of life, the more our minds are lifted to the heights, where earth meets heaven, and God is seen to be at the heart of all that we do. Each moment, sacred and filled with glory, we become the recipients of paradise on earth. Once we realise the import of "finding God amidst the pots and pans" and genuflect to his enduring love and presence in our lives, the more we can understand the teaching of Emily Dickenson that "life is so startling it leaves little time for anything else", we become more attuned not only to God, but to the nature of our true expectations for a fulfilled life here on earth. We don't need to go chasing rainbows looking for some ultimate experience elsewhere. It is here in our midst each and every day. All we need do is notice it, and rest in the tender arms of the Almighty.
