
Father John ponders......

"...what I focus on in life is what I get. And if I concentrate on how bad I am or how wrong I am or how inadequate I am, if I concentrate on what I can't do and how there's not enough time in which to do it, isn't that what I get every time? And when I think about how powerful I am, and when I think about what I have left to contribute, and when I think about the difference I can make on this planet, then that's what I get. You see, I recognize that it's not what happens to you; it's what you do about it." -- W. Mitchell

How do we make our way in life? This has been one of the main questions which humanity has posed to itself. Philosophies abound about the nature of the human condition and how to solve the puzzle of making advancement. Most of these ideas deal with the secular world and make recommendations about how to get on in life. We might also consider more religious philosophies which ignore this life and concentrate on the life to come. The Judeo-Christian position includes both approaches. We only have to think about the wisdom literature of the Old Testament to get the idea that we are given solid advice on how to flourish in this world by living a life of virtue. The moral vision of the Catholic Church likewise encourages living well the commandments of God in this world to be prepared for the Kingdom of Heaven.

Our quotation today may seem a bit obscure, but it conveys the wisdom of centuries. In short: what I concentrate on I get more of! It is very easy to concentrate on the bad things which happen to us, and when our concentration is geared to the bad stuff of life then it is primed to see it. The same is true about the weaker sides of ourselves. If that is the only thing we see, then that is what will keep showing up.

Becoming agents of our lives (with the help of the Holy Spirit) we can become free of attitudes which leave us stranded in life and beholden to the external and negative perceptions which can hold us back. When we become agents of our lives we are in a position to do something about life and not to be fooled into thinking we are at the behest of external things. We need a new vision of ourselves as good and capable individuals who are not going to be thrown around by life, but people who can take life by the scruff of the neck and make sure we handle life to our advantage. Looking out for the positive is a sure way of priming ourselves to benefit from what life has to offer. If we can be on the lookout for what might be opportunities to be virtuous, we can follow the Lord Jesus through death into Resurrection. What better outcome?

PARISH BANKING BECOMES MORE DIFFICULT

Since the start of the new financial year our bank has made it more difficult for the parish to bank coins. It has removed the machine that allowed us to deposit coins directly into the parish account.

Now we are required to count individually each denomination of coin, total them all up, and then prepare a special deposit bag that we have to lodge separately for it to be remotely processed.

It would assist the parish greatly if the amount of coin placed in the collection bags at Mass each weekend could be limited to just \$2 and \$1 coins.

Thank you all for the donations you make – these are vital to keep our parish running, and if you can see your way clear to increasing them slightly this would help even more!


