Father John ponders......

"We tell ourselves so many lies and half-truths ... We listen and are duly impressed by these inner voices that turn into unseen judges that nag at us. We give each of these judges a seat of honour in our minds, all the while hating their guts and their never-ending supply of judgements ... We give these judges permission to accompany us on each journey of life, never daring to realize that we can park them, at least momentarily."

Most people appear to carry a heavy burden, an inner voice of constant criticism, which does not seem to leave them alone. We carry it around with us even though we haven't invited this critic to be anywhere near us. Its nagging voice depletes our energies and we struggle to get on with the day. The internal judge diminishes our sense of self-worth and pulverises us into believing that we are little more than a worm. Our sense of agency in the world is affected and we end up not achieving as well as we know we can. Is there no end to this barrage of negativity we let loose upon ourselves?

To call it a "guilty conscience" does not do justice to what the conscience is there for. The conscience is an aspect of the intellect, an objective tool to help us distinguish in our behaviour if we have contravened God's commandments. Any other negative emotions or ideas about ourselves are likely to be but dross. Yet we continue to do ourselves a grave injustice by thinking less than we should about ourselves. Given that we are made in the Image of God, we might conclude that our thinking is somewhat grubby. How do we deal with this?

We need to get ourselves on the right footing. Establish a positive foundation and framework for wholesome thoughts and positive achievement. We have acquired negative thinking about ourselves from various sources as we have grown up. These outside messages have formed a swirl of self-condemnation which we have come to believe to be the truth about ourselves. We need to take the bull by the horns and challenge each and every negative thought about ourselves. What is not true needs to be abandoned. What continues to cause disturbance within needs to be jettisoned. We cannot grow in self-esteem and personal confidence while we continue to be assaulted by an internal critic which seeks only to destroy.

We have carried within us these critics for so long that we now presume that they are right. In shifting our perception of them we can learn that these inner critics are not what they appear to be. Most of them are certainly not helpful and leave us in a state of despondency. Not much use for a child of God, is it? If we want to flourish we need to open ourselves up to the grace of God and begin at the beginning knowing that we have been enlightened by Christ.

PARISH BANKING BECOMES MORE DIFFICULT

Since the start of the new financial year our bank has made it more difficult for the parish to bank coins. It has removed the machine that allowed us to deposit coins directly into the parish account.

Now we are required to count individually each denomination of coin, total them all up, and then prepare a special deposit bag that we have to lodge separately for it to be remotely processed.

It would assist the parish greatly if the amount of coin placed in the collection bags at Mass each weekend could be limited to just \$2 and \$1 coins.

Thank you all for the donations you make – these are vital to keep our parish running, and if you can see your way clear to increasing them slightly this would help even more!
