Father John ponders......

"You can never get to peace and inner security without first acknowledging all of the good things in your life. If you're forever wanting and longing for more without first appreciating things the way they are, you'll stay in discord." (Doc Childre and Howard Martin)

Staying in balance is a requirement for a healthy and stable psychology for each and every one of us. We yearn to feel normal and unperturbed in living each day to the fullest of our capacity. Disturbances leave us feeling uncomfortable, possibly for an extended period of time. This can have an impact on how successful we judge ourselves to have lived when we come to the close of day. This can then spill over to spoil a restful night. How do we get ourselves out of such a knot?

Part of staying in balance is not to shoot ahead of our capacities constantly yearning for more in our lives. We might imagine that if certain people or things come our way, only then can we be happy. There is plenty of evidence to show that this rarely happens. Yet we continue to dream on, hoping for a quick fix to our bottomless pit of cravings. Which leaves us unaware of all the good things in our lives which are already in evidence.

Beginning to acknowledge all the good which we have can start the ball rolling to appreciate what is there, and then to be grateful for it can help us to reset our out-of-balance thoughts and feelings. It is not healthy to neglect reality as it is and demand a "silver spoon" to make things perfect. Reality is, and no amount of wrangling is going to change it. Changing ourselves is far more important than demanding that reality changes to suit ourselves. If we are going to be mature then we need to take on life as it presents itself – and be grateful for what we find.

Gratitude is one of the most underutilised virtues which God has given us. If we were to be entirely honest and began to say thanks for all that we have received, one whole day would not be enough time to write it all down. Giving God thanks has many positive aspects. First of all it acknowledges God as the originator of all that is good and then sets the true relationship between Him and ourselves, that is, Father and Children. Secondly, it is a matter of justice that the giver of gifts should receive gratitude. Another point is that we acknowledge how much we are already well blessed with all that we receive and need to give thanks. This helps us to have a more conducive perspective to how to assess where I fit into my life and the lives of others. Achieving inner balance involves being grateful for what we already have and doing without the other stuff for which we might crave.
