#### Father John ponders......

"Homogeneity makes for healthy milk but anaemic friendships. We need relationships that cross culturally imposed lines to enlarge our hearts and expand our vistas." (Dan Schmidt)

It has been a constant cry in the Old Testament that we should give a warm welcome to strangers. While the stranger in those days may be not quite so defined as in our modern era with mass communications so evident in our lives, the Church herself has been just as determined to encourage us to continue to welcome the stranger. This insistence should mellow our hearts for those among us who are struggling to make a living, confused by a very different cultural milieu and to fit in in order to flourish as a human being. People from overseas who have chosen to live in Australia, and been granted to do so by the government, deserve our support because they are made in the Image of God. This is the true homogeneity of which Dan Schmidt speaks today in our quotation. The bare bones of humanity is that we are all the same, conferred with the Image of God.

We need to see beyond the superficial differences of colour, culture and creed. God has not decreed that one culture is any better than another culture, nor that one colour supersedes another colour. Variety is a gift of creation which we need to learn to embrace in order to fulfil Christ's command to love one another as He has loved us. Of course one culture or nation may see itself as superior to others. Let us never forget the Teutonic Superman, an idea espoused by Adolf Hitler, which posed this very idea to the detriment of so many peoples' deaths in concentration camps and in war.

We have many cultures in Australia. Sometimes there is trouble between them initiated by the few who have little idea of cohesion and understanding. They are willing to be bounded by a narrow view of one culture against another. But cultures emerge according to circumstances of one kind or another. Who is right? God's culture of course: the one about self-sacrificing love for the sake of the world. The psychologist Karl Jung put it nicely when he referred to the "Echo Chamber" describing people who only listen and associate with people who think only like themselves. Their prejudices are constantly reinforced. And, unfortunately, critical thinking is no longer available to them. Who on earth would want to associate with anyone in that position of personal enclosure?

As Christians we look to the world, we welcome the stranger who may very well have something valuable to offer us by way of fresh insights and different perspectives on life and love. Widening our own minds is a precious gift by which we expand our experience of life and flourishing and, perhaps, reach out to God.
