Father John ponders......

"Handle them carefully, for words have more power than atom bombs."

-- Pearl Strachan Hurd

Our quotation today may seem to be somewhat over the top. With TV to bring us pictures, we have been privy to all the wars since the end of World War II, and previously in the newspapers. At the moment we have plenty of wars whereby we continually see the devastation in Ukraine, Gaza and elsewhere. We are also well aware of the two atom bombs dropped on Japan in 1945. Yet, Pearl Strachan Hurd does have a point to make. Words can be very powerful, even more powerful than atom bombs! They can stir hearts, they can cause revolutions, they can spread ideologies for good or bad. In this respect words can be used for us or against us. How careful must we be?

On this Sunday when we celebrate the new Mass of Creation, during the Season of Creation, let us consider just six words that were far more powerful than all atomic weapons conceivable put together both now and in the future. They are the six words which brought about creation. On each of the six days God speaks a word (in the Hebrew text) and low and behold things really begin to happen. By the sixth day humanity comes into being, resembling God Himself, as male and female. They are given the first commandment: to be fruitful, multiply and fill the earth. What a superior participation in the continuing work of creation, to bring into being other Images of God. On the seventh day God spoke another word and swore an oath to uphold His creation.

For God, His words are sacred and are used to build up. Creation is still with us, we are here for a time to enjoy creation to the very best of our abilities. Then we hand over to the next generation, as God ordained. In spite of our willfulness God has also brought into existence both salvation and sanctification. Note the precious seven words Christ spoke on the cross, words of forgiveness and love by which we are no longer victims of the assault wrought on humanity by Satan. Because of Christ it is now possible for us to flourish in virtue living lives acceptable to God and being restored to His likeness. Talk about the power of words being more powerful than atom bombs! Warfare destroys, God builds up.

Likewise, our duty as Christians is to speak powerful words throughout our lives. Like God these words need to be creative, building up others rather than knocking them down no matter how we feel about the other. Likewise, we need to speak these creative words to ourselves, honest words, so that we can become stronger in this fallen world through which we have to get through one way or the other. To become agents in a world which has so much to give in establishing a new humanity in Christ. Let us participate in God's work.
