Father John ponders......

"When busyness is the measure of time, no matter how much time exists it is never enough."

Ever thought of putting up your feet and taking some much needed time for yourself? It can be a brave thing to do especially when all life's tasks are piling up all around you. All you need is something else more to do and your spirit sags, you can't find your slippers, and you may as well get it done while there's time, and you go to bed exhausted and sleep badly. Well done human beings! We are over-exposed to competing with ourselves in the race to get everything done. True, we may get a profound sense of self-glorification that we are so industrious that others are just lazy hangers-on and not fit for purpose. A poor assessment of the rest of humanity! Have they something to teach us? We might be instructed by the timely wisdom of Thomas Gray, in his famous *Elegy Written in a Country Churchyard*: "The paths of glory lead but to the grave". Not much of an epitaph for our grave headstone is it? The adage "hold your horses applies directly to us." So, where do we go from here? Slow down?

Slow down exactly! We need to remind ourselves of our true life's purpose which is to be united to God, for here is our eternity not the issues of this world which will pass away. Drawing closer to the Creator and Redeemer is our purpose and to become more and more familiar with God and his intentions for us. During Advent we can decide to take some time-out to dispose ourselves to his heavenly delights. But we do need to build into our daily routine that precious time.

Meditation is a beginning way to savour the mind of God. This involves our intellects where, to an extent, we are in charge. It involves taking a passage of scripture, reading through it a few times, absorbing it thoroughly, and trying to find the meaning and purpose of what is being taught. **Contemplation** is quite different. True contemplation is infused by God directly and we are not in charge. This can be quite difficult because we are required to let go of the reigns of control. God becomes both the teacher and the Beloved. For the highly active person this might be experienced as time lost and not worth the bother. An agitation creeps in which might adversely effect the contemplation. We may be so concentrated on ourselves that we demand quick fixes in our spiritual lives. Here we run into the problem of the ages: God summons us on His terms, we don't summon Him! The language of God is silence, which cannot be rushed. This is likely to take years but the effort is worth it. Engaging with the Divine is our life's intention. Let us not spoil it!
