Father John ponders.....

"The word 'question' is derived from the Latin 'quarrier' (to seek) which is also the root of 'quest.' A creative life is a continued quest, and good questions can be very useful guides. Most useful are open-ended questions; they allow for fresh unanticipated answers to reveal themselves." -- Source Unknown

One of the deepest questions we can ask is "what is this world all about?". Much literature has been written over thousands of years and remains valid to this day. So many answers to just one question. The ancients loved good stories and would pay well to hear them. Many were in the form of a quest undertaken by somebody who went through many trials and tribulations, overcoming them and providing a good example to follow. Endurance is the name of the game. Homer's *Odyssey* or Virgil's *Aeneid* are just two examples of how overcoming the odds we might get our questions answered. More modern examples also abound such as the *Star Wars* series where the question of how to overcome evil is presented in dramatic fashion. And people are faced with their own frailties. Facing oneself is one of the oldest questions seeking an answer there is.

Finding oneself can be a bit of an arduous task because often we don't know where to begin. Part of the problem is we do not necessarily ask the right question in the first place. It is an unfortunate trait of fallen humanity to be so self-absorbed in wondering who we might be that we are enclosed in a cocoon with little ability to step out of the box and see afresh. For the Christian there is the light of faith to help us on our quest in asking questions of a deep nature. What is this world all about seeks more than just a scientific answer about a material explanation. It is to seek meaning and purpose in the creation. Taking a wider view we know and believe that we are made in the Image of God and our questions become clearer and more focused. Questions such as where do I come from, where am I going, and how do I get there become far more important and relevant to us in looking for a resolution about who I am.

Once our minds are firmly established in the knowledge of the Image of God we can let our thoughts run riot in creative question where the answers we seek guide the questions we ask. Because, the intellect will not be satisfied until we know and understand the wisdom of God. We abandon superfluous questions about the nature of things and concentrate on the true answers of God's intentions in the salvation of humanity and what it means to be forever in heaven with God. For this to happen we need to ask the correct questions and open ourselves to the Lord's answers.
