YEAR OF SAINT FRANCIS PRAYER

Saint Francis, our brother, you who eight hundred years ago went to meet Sister Death as a man at peace, intercede for us before the Lord. You recognized true peace in the Crucifix of San Damiano, teach us to seek in Him the source of all reconciliation that breaks down every wall. You who, unarmed, crossed the lines of war and misunderstanding, give us the courage to build bridges where the world raises up boundaries. In this time afflicted by conflict and division, intercede for us so that we may become peacemakers: unarmed and disarming witnesses of the peace that comes from Christ. Amen

This weekend we give ourselves the opportunity to reflect on the Year of Saint Francis. This prayer is authorised by Pope Leo XIV to give us light and strength in associating our spiritual lives and life-efforts with the sanctity of Saint Francis. We know that the good saint was a beacon of hope in a perilous age but whose preferential option was always for the poor. This was exemplified by his own dedication to Lady Poverty. His charisma drew so many other people to him who wanted to dedicate their lives to God without the hinderance of the things of this world.

His universal view on life led him to see so many things as his brothers and sisters which he understood to be helpers in understanding the ways of God. Referring to himself as Brother Ass was a tribute to his humility as disavowing his own self-importance especially when he got in the way of revealing the Lord Jesus Christ. And all with such a joyful demeanor that others couldn't help themselves to be part of his company. His only point of reference was Jesus Christ and the building up of his Church. His spirituality of simplicity was certainly an apostolic/pastoral one for he served others graciously and with no thought for himself. In adopting this attitude throughout his life, himself always in the background, he relied so heavily on the Holy Spirit that his works were so successful.

His own beautiful prayer, encouraging us all to be channels of peace, is a daily encouragement to spur each of us to bring the peace of God to all we meet. The more we can see this to be true the more we can embolden ourselves to be true imitators of Saint Francis that his efforts to re-humanise humanity may thwart the hatred and division which can spring up so easily among fallen humanity. Let each of us take a leaf out of Francis' book and do what little we can to bring about a new world. Saint Francis, Man of Peace, pray for us.

The parish is currently experiencing a major system failure affecting the **Church, Parish Office, Presbytery, and Hall**. This was caused by a recent **thunderstorm and lightning strike**, which resulted in significant damage to our equipment.

We are awaiting assessments from both the Audio/Visual specialist and the computer technician. Their reports will allow us to submit the necessary documentation to the **insurance company** to determine whether an insurance claim can be made.
